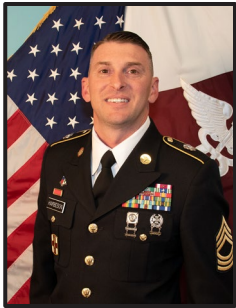

Master Sergeant William Harbeson is a Biomedical Equipment Maintenance Sergeant (68A) Stationed with the United States Army Medical Materiel Agency (USAMMA) at Fort Detrick, Maryland. He is currently an intern in the Strategic Medical Logistics Fellows Program. He serves as the NCOIC of the Medical Maintenance Management Division (M3D). He is a subject matter expert in not only Medical Maintenance but Medical Logistics as a whole. His primary duties are to serve as Medical Maintenance Consultant to Theater Army Surgeons; plan, direct, coordinate and monitor medical maintenance operations; conduct MEDLOG management information system pre-deployment training (DMLSS and GCSS-A), and implement plans, procedures, and programs for medical materiel management systems.

MSG Harbeson was born in Charleston, South Carolina. He grew up in Columbus, Georgia. He entered the U.S. Army in March 2007. MSG Harbeson attended Basic Combat Training (BCT) at Fort Sill, OK and Advanced Individual Training (AIT) at Sheppard AFB and awarded the Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) of 68A, Biomedical Equipment Technician. After graduation, he served as a Biomedical Equipment Maintenance Technician at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center in Landstuhl, Germany. He served as the shop foreman at Fort Hood, Texas with the 582nd Medical Logistics Company. While stationed in Fort Hood he deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF-12-13) to Bagram, Afghanistan. He served as the Division Shop Supervisor at USAMM, Medical Maintenance Operations Division (MMOD), Hill AFB, Utah. MSG Harbeson served as the Medical Maintenance NCOIC and 3rd Platoon Sergeant at the 563rd Medical Logistics Company, Camp Carroll, Korea.
