COL Deon D. Maxwell is a native of Houston, TX, and began his career as an enlisted Soldier (56M, Chaplain's Assistant) in 1990. COL Maxwell's first enlisted assignment was to Germany's 3rd Infantry Division where he served in the 10th Engineer Battalion and 1st Battalion, 15th Infantry Regiment. He then served in the 30th Adjutant General Battalion, 1st Battalion, 18th Infantry Regiment, and 1st Battalion, 11th Infantry Regiment at Fort Benning, GA. He also served as Instructor Writer/Platoon Sergeant for the Chaplain Center and School at Fort Jackson, SC.

In 2001, COL Maxwell was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Medical Service Corps through the University of South Carolina ROTC. During his first officer assignment, he served as Division Medical Supply Officer, Ambulance Platoon Leader, and Battalion S1/Adjutant for the 27th Main Support Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division at Fort Hood, TX. His follow-on assignment was as Brigade S4 for the 32nd Medical Brigade, AMEDD Center and School at Fort Sam Houston, TX. He then served as Aide-de-camp for the Medical Research and Materiel Command, and Chief of Operations, Deputy Director of Force Integrations, and Chief of Plans for the United States Medical Materiel Agency at Fort Detrick, MD.

COL Maxwell has also served as Chief of Medical Logistics for the United States Army Special Operations Command, Battalion Executive Officer for the 261st Multifunctional Medical Battalion, and Brigade S4 for the 44th Medical Brigade at Fort Bragg, NC. His command assignments include Company Commander for the 187th Medical Battalion at Fort Sam Houston, TX; Commander for the 28th Combat Support Hospital (Rear Provisional) at Fort Bragg, NC; and Commander for the 131st Field Hospital at Fort Bliss, TX. His deployment experience includes tours as Battalion S1/ Adjutant, 27th Main Support Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division (OIF) and Theater Medical Logistics Planner, CENTCOM Materiel Recovery Element, 1st Theater Sustainment Command (OEF).

He holds a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from the University of South Carolina; a Master's in Healthcare Administration from Webster University; a Master's in Business Administration and a Graduate Certificate in Strategic Leadership from Trident University; and a Master's in Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College.
