LTC Wagner's prior duty assignments include Medical Operations Officer, 261st Area Support Medical Battalion; Treatment Platoon Leader and Executive Officer, 36th Area Support Medical Company; Battalion S4, 32nd Medical Logistics Battalion (Forward); Logistics Plans and Operations Officer, 44th Medical Command; Medical Logistics Officer, Joint Special Operations Command and J4, Joint Medical Augmentation Unit; Detachment Commander and CENTCOM Division Chief, 6th Medical Logistics Management Center; Operations Officer, U.S. Army Medical Materiel Agency; Chief, Medical Logistics, XVIII Airborne Corps; Executive Officer, 28th Combat Support Hospital/16th Hospital Center; Brigade S4, 44th Medical Brigade; and Chief of Logistics, U.S. Army Medical Department Activity-Bavaria. He currently serves as the Executive Officer to the Director of Policy and Force Integration, Headquarters, Department of the Army Office of the Surgeon General, and Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations, G-3/5/7, U.S. Army Medical Command.
